- Ms. Anumitha K, (Final BHMS) under the esteemed mentorship of Dr. Venkatesan Hariram, Head of the Department of Medicine, presented her research titled "Evaluation of Antioxidant and Xanthine Oxidase Inhibitory Activities of Formicum Acidum 6CH & 30CH in the Management of Hyperuricemia," showcasing its significance in homeopathic interventions. Her exceptional contribution earned first place in the U.G. Level Paper Presentation.
- Dr. Ruthikaa V (PG -Department of Organon of Medicine) "Phytochemical Characterization, FTIR, and GC-MS Analysis of Bauhinia variegata Flower Ethanolic Extract and Its Cytotoxic and Antioxidant Effects on the SW579 Thyroid Cancer Cell Line" examined the phytochemical profile of Bauhinia variegata and its therapeutic impact on thyroid cancer cell viability, highlighting its antioxidant potential.
